## Pavement Parking

NLC parking manager has advised the following.

As you may be aware, in 2019 the Scottish Parliament passed the Transport (Scotland) Act 2019 which included powers to introduce three new parking prohibitions nationally. These ban parking on pavements, at dropped kerbs at known crossing places, and double parking. The Parking Prohibitions (Enforcement and Accounts) (Scotland) (Regulations) 2023 were enacted on 11 December 2023, which provided local authorities with the powers to enforce the new parking prohibitions. The enforcement of the parking restrictions contained in the Transport (Scotland) Act within North Lanarkshire was agreed at the Council's Environment and Climate Change Committee on 7 February 2024. It was previously expected that the Council's Parking Attendants would be able to enforce these restrictions from Spring 2024. However, before the Council can commence enforcement, it is necessary to make changes to the existing back-office support and provide additional training to staff. As Glasgow City Council provides the back-office support for the Council's parking enforcement service, it will not be possible for us to commence enforcement before Glasgow City Council do. At present, it is anticipated that it will be three or four months before the Council is able to undertake enforcement duties in this regard. Please note that we will be publicising the commencement of this enforcement via the council's website and social media channels. With regards to the deployment of parking attendants, it is our intention to initially focus enforcement action in areas with high pedestrian activity. It should further be noted that we will not be able to attend a location on every occasion when we are made aware of parking issues.

#### Loch Road, Stepps

An inspection has been carried out with the developer and there will now be a period of 12 months monitoring, at the end of this period another inspection will be carried out to identify any remedial works and at that point the road will be placed on the 12 month maintenance period, following that period the road will be adopted assuming no significant issues arise during this period.

#### Comrie Road, Millerston

I am aware that the hatching has still to be completed on Cumbernauld Road, whilst our existing contractor had an instruction to do this, they were unable to complete the work before

the end of their contract with the council. We are entering a new contract from 1st October, and I will ensure this work is instructed to our new contractor.

Looking at the next meeting we are early shift again so most likely won't be able to attend, I'll send another email nearer the time when it is confirmed who my replacement will be.


#### **6.0 Environmental Report**

# 8.2 Festive Lighting at Stepps

Paul Noble reported that the estimated cost for this service would be £3,411.67 + VAT. This includes the costs associated with the erection of decorations, storage, electrical testing and certification, weekly inspections to ensure they are in a safe condition and energy. The estimate does not include any one-off costs for the repair of lights or for attending site to address damages when they are installed. The estimate assumes that the lights will be switched on at the time of installation and any switch on events will result in additional costs.

All features will be electrically tested and repaired where required however where features are beyond economical repair this will result in changes to what can be erected on site.

The meeting agreed that in terms of cost and timing this project would not be progressed.

- **8.3 Winter Webinar Series** is running from November through to March in collaboration with Planning Democracy. The theme is Biodiversity and the Planning System, with each monthly webinar exploring important topics, such as how local wildlife monitoring feeds into planning decisions, how conditions work in planning, and the role of Nature Networks.
